To (closely) respect Deleuze's rhizomatic structure of thinking, the index is coded to indicate the following:

- Concepts; these are shown with page references after (:).
- Selected key concepts; these are in italics.
- Contrasted concepts; these are shown in brackets [] together with the page reference.
- Conceptual categories; these are listed out under each concept after (≈).
- Comparative conceptual analysis; these are shown with (and).
- Conceptual discussions made by other thinkers; these are shown with (in).
- Conceptual evolution in the text; this is shown with (→) between page references.
- Conceptual details and related concepts; these are indicated in brackets ().

*The index is to be used on the (wise) condition to have read the book at least once.*
